

MENTAL ILLNESS AND SUBSTANCE MISUSE DATA HUB

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

<u>RIWI</u> is seeking feedback and interest on a proposed solution to better understand and address barriers facing those with mental illness and substance misuse across the United States. RIWI's proposed solution involves the creation of a centralized, integrated, and interactive platform that captures the most critical social, institutional, and political indicators that serve as barriers to healthy living and prosperity among these vulnerable populations.

THE CHALLENGE

Substance misuse and mental illness are two critical public health crises. The <u>US CDC estimates</u> over 100,000 drug overdose deaths in 2021. In <u>SAMHSA's most recent (2020) report</u>, nearly 53 million adults in the US were estimated to have a mental illness, with over 14 million having a serious mental illness. 17 million were estimated to have a comorbidity of mental illness and substance use disorder.

The social, institutional, and political structures that exist across the US are monumental in determining outcomes for people with mental illness and/or substance use disorder. To most effectively evaluate, identify, and address these problematic (and vastly intertwined) systems, these indicators must be integrated into a centralized platform on a systematic and ongoing basis. Only then can policy-makers, community leaders, and stakeholders harness the full picture to best address barriers in their communities, and in turn enable long-term positive outcomes for these vulnerable populations.
